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# SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

*The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).*

*The notation '[DP]' in a rule in the SI means that the penalty for a breach of that rule may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.*

## ORGANISING AUTHORITY

Ceduna Sailing Club is the Organising Authority for the regatta in conjunction with the Skate Sailing Association of Australia (SSAA).

### 1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by:
  - The rules as defined in The 2025-2028 Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) and the Prescriptions of Australian Sailing ([Download a Copy](#))
  - The Australian Sailing Special Regulations - Part 2 for Off the Beach Boats. ([Download a Copy](#))
  - The Special Rules of the Skate Sailing Association of Australia (updated July 2025) ([Download a Copy](#))
  - these Sailing Instructions.
- 1.2 If there is conflict between any of the rules or regulations, other than RRS, the Sailing Instructions will prevail.

### 2 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 2.1 Any change to the Sailing Instructions will be posted no later than 1100 hours on the day it will take effect.
- 2.2 Any change to the schedule of races shall be posted by 1800 hours on the day before it will take effect.

### 3 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 3.1 Notices will be posted on the Online Notice Board located at <https://skatesailingaustralia.org/calendar.html> and on the whiteboard located near the club entrance.
- 3.2 [NP] From the first warning signal until the end of the last race of the day, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communication that is not available to all boats.



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### 4 CODE OF CONDUCT

- 4.1 Competitors and support persons shall comply with reasonable requests from race officials.
- 4.2 Competitors and support persons shall place advertising provided by the organising authority in accordance with any relevant instructions.

### 5 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 5.1 Signals made ashore shall be made on the flag mast located on the north-western side of the Clubhouse.
- 5.2 When Flag AP (red with white bands) is displayed ashore "1 minute" is replaced with "not less than 30 minutes" in the Race Signal AP.

### 6 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 6.1 The Regatta Schedule is shown in Attachment 1.
- 6.2 The scheduled time of the warning signal for each race is defined in the Regatta Schedule.
- 6.3 No Warning Signal shall be made after 1530 hours on 8 January 2026.

### 7 CLASS FLAG

- 7.1 The Skate Class flag will be a green Skate emblem on a white background.

### 8 RACING AREA

- 8.1 The racing area will be on the waters of Murat Bay as depicted in Attachment 2.

### 9 COURSES

- 9.1 Attachment 3 shows the approximate course layouts, the order in which the marks are to be passed and the side on which the marks are to be left.

### 10 MARKS

- 10.1 Marks 1, 2 and 3 will be yellow inflatable cylinders.
- 10.2 The Start and Finish Mark will be a buoy displaying a black and yellow chequered flag.
- 10.3 A new mark, as provided in Instruction 13.1, will be a pink inflatable cylinder.
- 10.4 A Race Committee boat signalling a change of a leg of the course is a mark as provided in Instruction 13.2.

### 11 OBSTRUCTIONS

- 11.1 While racing, the area between any registered moorings and the adjacent shoreline shall be considered PROHIBITED WATER, and therefore an obstruction.



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### 12 THE START

- 12.1 Races will be started using RRS 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal.
- 12.2 The Start Line will be between a flagstaff displaying a orange flag on the Committee Vessel at the starboard end of the line and a buoy displaying a black and yellow chequered flag at the port end.
- 12.3 A boat that does not start within ten minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing.

### 13 CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE

- 13.1 To change the next leg of the course, the race committee will lay a new mark (or move the finishing line) and remove the original mark as soon as practicable. When in a subsequent change a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced by an original mark.
- 13.2 Boats shall pass between the race committee boat signalling the change of the next leg and the nearby mark, leaving the mark to port and the race committee boat to starboard. This changes RRS 33.

### 14 THE FINISH

- 14.1 The Finish Line will be between a flagstaff displaying a orange flag on the Committee Vessel at the starboard end of the line and a buoy displaying a black and yellow chequered flag at the port end.

### 15 TIME LIMITS & TARGET TIMES

- 15.1 The Mark 1 Time Limit, Race Time Limit (see RRS 35), and the Finishing Window are shown in the following table:

Mark 1 Time Limit	Race Time Limit	Finishing Window
30 minutes	100 minutes	30 minutes

- 15.2 If no boat has passed the first mark within the Mark 1 Time Limit, the race will be abandoned.
- 15.3 The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, and not subsequently retiring, penalised or given redress, will be scored Time Limit Expired (TLE) without a hearing. A boat scored TLE shall be scored points for the finishing place one more than the number of starters in the race. This changes RRS 35, A5.1, A5.2 and A10.

### 16 PROTESTS & REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 16.1 The Race Officer of the Day or their nominated representative shall represent the Race Committee for the purpose of protesting a boat, requesting redress or reporting to the protest committee. This changes RRS 60.2.



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- 16.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the last boat finishes the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later. The same time limit applies to protests by the race committee and protest committee about incidents they observe in the racing area, and to requests for redress.
- 16.3 Protest Forms will be available from the Onshore Coordinator in the Bridge, upstairs in the clubhouse, and delivered back to them within the protest time limit.
- 16.4 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses, the order of hearings and the time of the first hearing.

### 17 SCORING

- 17.1 Seven heats are scheduled for the Championship, and five heats shall be completed to constitute the Championship.
- 17.2 When fewer than six heats have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of all her race scores.
- 17.3 When six or seven heats have been completed, a boat's score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
- 17.4 RRS A5.3 will apply.
- 17.5 The Invitation Race will be conducted in conjunction with the first heat of the Championship, with the winner being the Skipper of the first boat to the top mark on the second lap of the heat.
- 17.6 A Handicap Series will be conducted concurrently with the Championship (scratch) series. The Race Committee reserves the right to change a boat's handicap at any time and without notice.

### 18 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 18.1 [NP] [DP] Skippers must sign on at the Committee Vessel before racing commences. Skippers must approach the starboard side of the Committee Vessel and hail its crew with their boat's Sail Number and ensure they receive a response from the Committee vessel confirming their boat's Sail Number. Boats failing to sign on before starting the race will be scored DNS without a hearing for the first race for which they should have signed on.
- 18.2 Each skipper completing the race shall sign off at the Committee Vessel by hailing its crew with their boat's Sail Number as they finish, and ensure they receive a response from the Committee vessel confirming their boat's Sail Number.
- 18.3 A boat that retires shall notify the Onshore Coordinator in the Bridge upstairs in the clubhouse as soon as practicable after returning to shore.





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- 18.4 It is the responsibility of all competitors to ensure that life jackets comply with a standard equivalent to those listed in the Special Regulations of Australian Sailing – Part 2 for Off the Beach Boats.

### 19 REPLACEMENT OF CREW OR EQUIPMENT

- 19.1 Substitution of competitors will not be allowed without prior written approval of the Race Committee.
- 19.2 Substitution of damaged or lost equipment will not be allowed unless authorised by the Race Committee. Requests for substitution shall be made, in writing, to the Committee at the first reasonable opportunity.
- 19.3 When equipment is substituted during a series of races on the same day, the substitution request shall be made before the protest time limit expires on that day.

### 20 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

- 20.1 Each boat and all equipment shall have been measured by an approved Skate class Measurer in its home state prior to being used in a heat of this Championship. The Race Committee reserves the right to inspect any boat or equipment at any time for compliance with the class rules.

### 21 SUPPORT TEAMS

- 21.1 Team leaders, coaches and other support personnel shall stay a minimum of 50m outside areas where boats are racing from the time of the Preparatory Signal for the first start until all boats have finished or retired or the Race Committee signals a postponement, general recall or abandonment. This will apply at all times, except when a Support Boat is asked to assist by the Race Committee.

### 22 RUBBISH DISPOSAL

- 22.1 No rubbish is to be dumped into the water. All rubbish is to be handed to official boats or taken ashore.

### 23 PRIZES

- 23.1 Trophies and prizes to be awarded are listed in Attachment 4.

### 23 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 23.1 Competitors participate in all races entirely at their own risk. Attention is drawn to Fundamental Rule 3 of the RRS which states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone'.
- 23.2 The Organising Authority, its officers and servants, will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after racing, nor for the seaworthiness of a boat whose entry is accepted or the sufficiency or adequacy of its equipment or for damage which might result from competing in the Championship.



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- 23.3 The person who signs and lodges the boat's entry form acknowledges receipt of Rule 24 – RISK WARNING of these Sailing Instructions and releases the Organising Authority from any claim or liability whatsoever for any harm or personal injury suffered, by him/her or any person claiming through him/her in the Championship.
- 23.4 The person who signs and lodges the boat's Entry Form warrants the Club that he/she will draw the attention of any person onboard to Rule 24 – RISK WARNING of these Sailing Instructions.
- 23.5 The Organising Authority reserves the right to refuse an entry.

### 24 RISK WARNING

- 24.1 This RISK WARNING is issued by the Organising Authority to all persons wishing to participate in the sailing activities conducted by the Organising Authority.
- 24.2 Participants are warned that, regardless of the precautions, which might be taken by reasonable and experienced persons, sailing can be a dangerous pursuit, and participants are exposed to significant risk of property damage, physical harm and possibly death.
- 24.3 As an indication, these risks may include, but are not limited to:
- a) The extremes of weather and sea conditions.
  - b) The potential that control of vessels may be lost, resulting in collision with objects and other vessels.
  - c) The sudden movement of the vessel at any time and the possibility that participants may fall or be thrown overboard, resulting in drowning.
  - d) The possibility that participants may be injured by equipment on the vessel.
  - e) The absence of immediate medical care and the likelihood that significant delays may occur before medical care is available.
  - f) Exposure to the elements for extended periods.
- 24.4 The Organising Authority also warns participants that regardless of their best intentions, they may be unable to render assistance to participants who are in distress. Participants are warned to consider the above risks and all other risks before deciding to participate in the Championship.

### 25 INSURANCE

- 25.1 All competing boats shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with minimum cover of \$10,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.

A portable caged enclosure will be available adjacent to the club for boat and trailer storage. Use of this facility will be at the owner's risk.

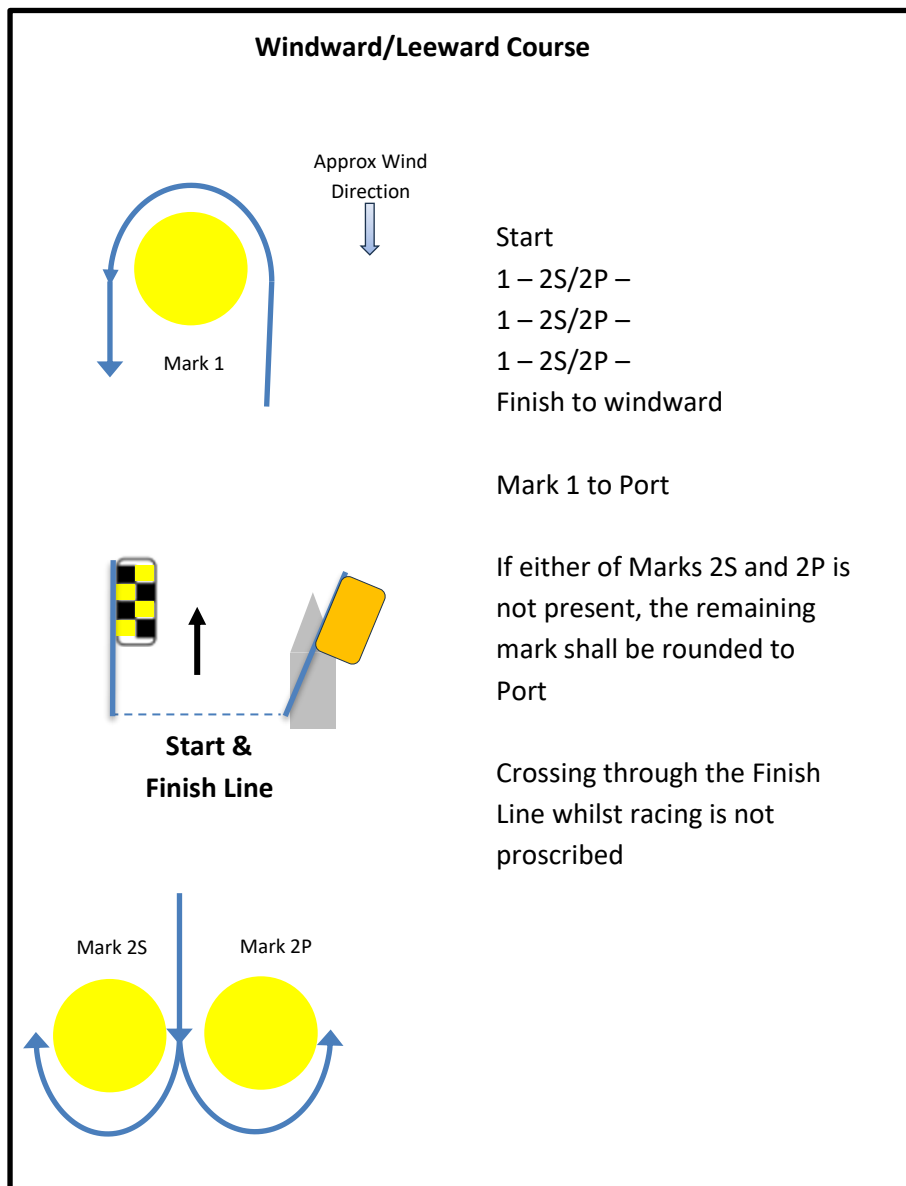
